#### **Post-Season Water Safety:**

Manasquan Beach Dept. has extended lifeguard coverage in order to allow residents to enjoy protected beaches during the month of September. Additionally, our beach staff, Police, Fire and First Aid have been working with the South Monmouth After-hours Response Team (SMART) to provide post season water rescue response to Manasquan's beaches. Please follow the directions of our Beach Patrol and never swim on unguarded beaches



#### Municipal Infrastructure Upgrades:

## Stockton Lake Boulevard Paving

Manasquan has received \$455,000 in municipal aid from NJDOT for paving, flood mitigation and drainage improvements along 0.4 miles of Stockton Lake Blvd. The project is scheduled to begin early October.

#### Main Street Paving

Manasquan received \$350,000 in municipal aid from NJDOT with a second grant pending for repaving, flood mitigation and drainage improvements on Main Street between the Bridge and the railroad tracks. The project is scheduled to begin early spring 2019.

#### Main Street Business District

Manasquan has received a \$1 mil grant from NJDOT for beautification of the Main Street Business District around Hwy 71. A subgroup of Manasquan's newly formed Citizens Advisory Committee has met several times to produce a conceptual design. A final design is expected by spring, and construction expected 2020.

## 25% Discount off Flood Insurance:

Effective May 1<sup>st</sup> of this year, residents will notice their annual flood insurance premiums reduced by 25% thanks to Manasquan's flood preparedness efforts. Manasquan is the only town to receive such distinction in Monmouth County, and one of only a handful in the State, saving residents over \$550,000 annually in flood insurance.

## Fall Leaf Pick-up (Oct 8 thru Dec 21):

Fall leaf collection will begin October 8<sup>th</sup> and continue through December 21<sup>st</sup>. Leaves are to be raked and left loose in the street. Please do not mix in branches, twigs or grass, as it damages our equipment. Branches may be bundled 3'x1' and placed curbside (not in the road) on the 1<sup>st</sup> garbage day of the week. DPW asks that you please try and park off of the street and remove all sports equipment from the street during this time frame in order to assist with leaf removal.

# Hydrant Flushing (Oct 1 thru Oct 12):

The Water Division will be flushing hydrants daily from 8am-3pm. Residents may experience harmless discolored water during this timeframe and are urged to run cold water to clear the discoloration.

## **Recycling:**

DPW would like to remind residents that recyclables must be placed loose in solid containers at the curb. Absolutely no plastic bags are permitted.
