RESOLUTION 129-2015

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH OF MANASQUAN TO PARTICIPATE IN INTRA-COUNTY MUTUAL AID AND ASSISTANCE AGREEMENTS WITH PARTICIPATING UNITS IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et. Seq., (“Act”) provides that any local governmental unit may enter into a contract with any other local governmental unit to provide or receive any service that each local unit is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, mutual aid and assistance agreements between municipalities, counties, law enforcement agencies, police, emergency medical service, fire departments, fire companies, or EMS organizations and fire departments situated in fire districts operated by a Board of Fire Commissioners, are permitted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 14-26 and 40A: 14-156.1; and

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD-5), directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (“NIMS”), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach to Federal, State, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity; and

WHEREAS, “The New Jersey Civilian Defense and Disaster Control Act” App.A9-33 et. seq., provides for the health, safety and welfare of the people of the State of New Jersey during any emergency by centralizing control of all civilian activities having to do with such emergency giving the Governor control over the resources of each and every political subdivision to cope with any condition that shall arise out of such emergency; and

WHEREAS, The Director of the Division of Fire Safety in the Department of Community Affairs promulgated rules in accordance with the “Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Act,” N.J.A.C. 52:14E-11 et. seq., commonly referred to as the “Fire Service Resource Emergency Deployment Regulations” N.J.A.C. 5:75A et. seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manasquan deem it to be in the best interests of the Borough of Manasquan to enter into Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreements with

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governmental entities throughout Monmouth County and all of their departments, authorities, boards, commissions and other functions under the auspices of each participating governmental entity including but not limited to, law enforcement, public works, emergency medical services, emergency management, human services, hazardous materials response units technical or special operations teams, Community Emergency Response Team (“CERT”) members, Medical Reserve Corps (“MRC”) members or other volunteers and other jurisdictions defined “local governments” in the Homeland Security Act of 2002; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 14-26 AND 156.1 et seq. has authorized interjurisdictional mutual aid; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor & Council of the Borough of Manasquan and the Participating Units recognize the benefit of entering into an Agreement for mutual aid and assistance with each other to protect against loss, damage or destruction by fire, civil unrest, hazardous material, major criminal or emergency events, natural and man-made disaster or catastrophe and to address those situations when additional aid and assistance is needed to protect the best interests of the persons and property of each individual jurisdiction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Intra-County Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreements between the Borough of Manasquan and Participating Units be and are hereby accepted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Municipal Emergency Management Coordinator and Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator are authorized to execute the Intra-County Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreements once they have been authorized and executed by each Participating Unit.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Clerk shall forward a certified true copy of this resolution to the Monmouth County Sheriff; Monmouth County Office of Emergency Management Coordinator; and appropriate Municipal Departments.

Council Member Donovan made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Council Member McCarthy. Motion carried unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Safety Committee – Council Member McCarthy reported on Fisherman’s Cove and dogs not being allowed on the beach area from Memorial Day to Labor Day from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and after 4 p.m. dogs are allowed back on the beach area if leashed. He advised that this is a decision by the Monmouth County Parks Department. He also reported on a pre-summer meeting with the MBIA and the police to keep the dialogue open for quality of life issues and if there are any problems residents should call the police department for assistance. He reported that Officer Hamill completed a one week training class offered by the Department of Criminal Justice at Fort Dix and is now certified in police firearms, pistol and shot gun instructor and will be attending police rifle certification in the fall. He also reported that there have been complaints about the basketball stanchions being placed on the curbside which is a violation of the Borough ordinance and asked that basketball stanchions not be placed at curbside. He reported that today was the DARE graduation and he thanked the police officers involved for doing this and that the program will not be funded by the State in the future.

Recreation & Environment – Council Member Olivera reported on the Parks Day event held on May 3 and what the resident concerns were with each park. He also reported on the recreation summer and fall programs and that the Shade Tree meeting has been cancelled for tomorrow night.

Administration & Finance Committee – Council Member Mangan reported that there is discussion on when the budget will be discussed, the continuation of getting current with reconciliations and tax records and current postings of revenue. He also reported that the Borough is still waiting for a new website, events calendar and a quarterly e-newsletter and he hopes to have an update on these items at the next meeting. He mentioned a report that was done and published with the breakdown of the OEM’s job that was done in the town. He thanked OEM and all involved in getting these projects completed. He also reported that Thursday is the Summer Kick Off Cocktail Party sponsored by Tourism at Leggetts.

Public Works & Grounds Committee – Council Member Donovan reported that bulk pickup is this week and 5 items can be placed at the curb on the first collection day of the week, after this week there will be no more bulk pick up until after Labor Day. He reported that if a new water meter is needed they can be picked up at the Superintendent’s Office on Iroquois Road from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday, Consumer Confidence Report is available on the Borough webpage and the shuffle board courts are in the process of being painted.

Building, Planning & Zoning Committee – Council Member Sinneck recapped the acceptance of the retirement of Charles Wills and thanked him for his many years of service. He also reported on the digitization of the code/construction/zoning documents to free up space. He reported on the activity in the code/construction/zoning departments with regards to permits and inspections.

Beach Committee – Council Member Lee thanked council for approving the various hiring for the beach season which starts this coming weekend. He reported that tomorrow is the dunes information meeting at Borough Hall in council chambers and that beach sales are at or above last year, Sea Watch parking is sold out and there are 19 lockers left to be leased. He also reported that the cameras at the beach area are being worked on.

Mary Ryan, 113 Beachfront stated that she believes there will be a good turnout for the dune meeting tomorrow. 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There was discussion on the previous restrictions on Ocean Avenue and why they were in affect and it was recommended that the committee look into the situation.

Council Member Sinneck made a motion to close the public portion, seconded by Council Member Mangan. Motion carried unanimously.

Council Member Donovan made a motion to close the regular meeting at 8:22 p.m. seconded by Council Member Mangan. Motion carried unanimously.
