BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE AQUISITION OF A PICK UP TRUCK AND PLOW FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS IN THE BOROUGH OF MANASQUAN, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, NEW JERSEY APPROPRIATING \$39,518.00 THEREFORE AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$37,000.00 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION

Council Member Donovan made a motion to introduce ordinance 2198-15, seconded by Council Member McCarthy. Motion carried by the following vote: "yes" Council Member Lee, Sinneck, Donovan, Mangan, Olivera, and McCarthy. "No" none.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Safety Committee – Council Member McCarthy reported that the Borough had a relatively safe summer along the beachfront and a lot of credit goes to the beach committee and the staff. He reported that schools have officially re-opened and ask parents to obey traffic regulations in the school zone on Broad Street. He reported that the DARE program in NJ has been emanated and replaced by a program LEAD (Law Enforcement Against Drugs) and Officer Stopera has been certified as the LEAD officer so there will be no break with students and Officer Stopera. He reported that the police department has received the amount of \$8,222 to the law enforcement trust fund as a result of a drug investigation conducted earlier in the year by Det. Lt. Jake Kleinknecht, Det. Adam Pharo, and Patrolman Norcia working in cooperation with the Point Pleasant Boro Police Department. He reported that there were 2 homes along the beach front area that did receive 3 noise/nuisance summonses over the course of the summer and they will be subject to Animal House penalties.

Recreation & Environment – Council Member Olivera congratulated the beach department on a successful season. He reported that the Little League shack is still down and replacement storage shed has been ordered. He also reported on the Infrastructure Protection and Stormwater Conveyance project also known as the Bulkhead Replacement Project will go out to bid this Thursday with bid opening expected with a month. He congratulated Tom Lozinski on his appointment tonight and he thanked Neil Paulsen for his years of service on Shade Tree Commission. He advised that he received a formal request to attend as the liaison to the Manasquan Library meeting and that he will report back to council the first meeting in October.

Administration & Finance Committee – Council Member Mangan reported that the committee met and discussed the current finance office staffing and the committee reviewed the Borough Debt overall and discussed specific project debt and he stated that the debt schedule remains unchanged from the beginning of the year. He reported that the Finance Committee and the Public Works Committee met separately to go over capital improvement projects including road projects. He thanked all Tourism members especially Chairman Ray Summers for all events that were organized this summer. He went over what the Board of Education is presenting to the public for the referendum election. He reported that based on the debt service for the Board of Education the increase for this project for the average household in Manasquan for the first seven years total is \$211.00 which is an average increase of \$30 per household per year. He stated that everyone should get clarity on the referendum and the tax impact on the residents.

Public Works & Grounds Committee – Council Member Donovan reported on the infrastructure projects that were originally planned for this year and as a result of the budget passing, how long it takes to get a

project on the street and the likelihood to have been able to do any major construction projects in 2015 they may not have been started this year. He reported that there is no reason to incur debt if the project is not going to start until next year and the committee is shooting for early spring projects. He reported that the elevation work on the pump stations is substantially completed, two new trucks will be ordered for DPW to replace trucks #7 and #8 and the trucks should be delivered by the end of the year. He advised that there will be a bulk garbage pickup for the week of September 14 and details are on the website and leaf pick up will begin on September 28 east of the railroad tracks which is also posted on the website.

Building, Planning & Zoning Committee – Council Member Sinneck reported on permits that have been issued for demolition and new homes and he reported that the department is on track for about 1400 permits for the year and that the work load is steady. He reported on the fees collected to date and the issuance of building permits for the month. He also reported on the certificate of occupancies issued and the annual realtor meeting where garbage removal for renters on Saturdays was discussed.

Beach Committee – Council Member Lee thanked everyone for their thoughts on the beach and he stated that the beach did a great job this year and he thanked all the staff. He reported that the current unaudited revenues are \$1,939,116.50 and reported that the season started out slow and then was really steady for the rest of the season. He thanked the committee and council for endorsing the Second Avenue Parking Lot Project which will beautify the area. He also reported that the Borough is in the process of receiving grant money for roll out mats for the beach openings and he is hoping for at least 17 mats from the grant money. He reported that the council recognized at the beach with certificates of appreciation going to 4 lifeguards that were involved in a rescue in Spring Lake of a boat on the rocks.

Mayor Dempsey inquired of Council Member Lee about the wiffleball tournament that was held at the beach.

Council Member Lee stated that it went well and he thinks that the organizer was surprised with the amount of teams that signed up and were disappointed in the younger group numbers.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Council Member Sinneck made a motion to open the meeting to the public, seconded by Council Member Donovan. Motion carried unanimously.

Teresa Graw, 480 Long Avenue voiced her concerns with a neighbor at 484 Long Avenue who is running a charter fishing business out of the back of his house and disturbing the neighbors. She also voiced her concerns about the mooring of the boat at the bulkhead as it is encroaching on her area of the bulkhead.

Council Member Sinneck gave Ms. Graw his phone number as this issue would fall under the Law and Code Committee and it is an enforcement issue. He stated that he will speak with the code enforcement officer tomorrow.

Council Member Olivera made a motion to close the public portion, seconded by Council Member Sinneck. Motion carried unanimously.

Council Member Donovan made a motion to close the regular meeting at 8:41 p.m. seconded by Council Member Mangan. Motion carried unanimously.
