Finding #1

Intefunds existed at year end.

Analysis:

Interfunds exist as a means of reducing bank accounts. Interfunds exist between our three major funds (Current, Beach and Water & Sewer) and their respective Capital

Funds.

Corrective Action:

None

Finding #2

The bank accounts were not being reconciled monthly on a timely basis.

Analysis:

In 2014 the senior tax collector's illness returned resulting in an extended absence. As a result, work assignments shifted to other duties and accounts were reconciled

but not monthly.

Corrective Action:

In 2015 the tax collector passed away and a new tax collector was promoted. The

Borough will be adding personnel to address the loss in staffing.

Finding #3

That not all receipts and disbursements were being posted in the general ledger on a

timely basis

Analysis:

Fund accounts normally posted to the General Ledger by the tax collector were not

posted on a timely basis due to her long term absence and eventual passing.

Corrective Action: While the Borough promoted an existing employee to the position of Tax Collector

after the passing of the former tax collector, the staffing issues mentioned above were not yet satisfied. In is expected that targeted staffing levels will return to full complement in 2016 which would allow for the timely postings of certain fund

accounts.

Finding # 4 That some of the monthly dog reports were not filled out correctly.

Analysis: The same problem existed in prior years as a result of the software program,

Muniaccess. The Borough has made several attempts to permit the software provider

to remedy the problem.

Corrective Action: In 2014 the Borough retained the services and new software of Sunrise Systems to be

implemented in January 2015. As a result, we anticipate the problem to be resolved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Works & Grounds – Council Member Lee thanked council for approving the water meter project and he thanked Public Works for a shared services agreement with Brielle where brine was put on the streets and in exchange Manasquan would help Brielle drill some holes for them. He also stated that Spring Lake lent us their sewer jet while the borough sewer jet was getting repaired. He voiced his support of the hazard mitigation master plan.

Building, Planning & Zoning – Council Member Walsh reported that he met with the code/construction department head Frank DiRoma and he has been advised that the State will be terminating the inspector that has been helping the Borough after Sandy. He reported that building permits are steady and elevation permits have dropped off. He went over some software that is being looked into for the department.

Beach Committee – Council Member McCarthy offered condolences on behalf of the Borough to Joan Harriman former planning board member on the passing of her husband. He reported that the beach committee has been busy with meetings and the implementation of a new program called VIPLY where badges can be purchased through an app online.

Public Safety Committee – Council Member Olivera reported on an accident on Route 71 near Dunkin Donuts where a telephone pole needed to be replaced. He reported that Officer Norcia completed a 6 day training class which would allow him to teach as an instructor, Officer Kevin Kleinknecht completed a 5 day training class in DWI detection and enforcement, and in February the police department had 4 drug arrests and 8 defiant trespass.

Special Services Committee – Council Member Read stated that he does not have a report at this time.

Administration and Finance Committee – Council Member Mangan reported that the committee is focused on the budget and he went over the upcoming budget dates.

Council Member McCarthy made a motion to open the meeting to the public, seconded by Council Member Olivera. Motion carried unanimously.

Marilyn Jacobson, 59 McLean Avenue inquired about the bulkhead and the boat renters submitting their rental fees for the year.

Mayor Donovan stated that all boat slip renters have been advised that the docks will not be ready and offered the opportunity to rent or not rent as soon as they become available and it would be prorated and they will be able to retain their slips in 2017.

Ms. Jacobson inquired about payment for the Water Treatment Plant lime system.

Mayor Donovan stated that the Borough is in litigation right now and it cannot be discussed.

Ms. Jacobson advised that at a Board of Education meeting there was a police officer who spoke about safe sidewalks for the kids walking to school and she voiced her concerns on the sidewalks not being cleared properly after a snow fall and the corners being plowed up at the corners.
