WHEREAS, in the 1990's, the Borough of Manasquan entered into a local cooperation agreement with New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) as local sponsors to the Federal Beach Erosion Shore Protection project which covered the oceanfront from Manasquan Inlet north to the Shark River Inlet; and

WHEREAS, all of the shoreline communities signed agreements to provide easements to construct and maintain the project as well as a financial contribution based on the length of shoreline in each Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the project design was for the 100 year storm event and called for a 50 year project life; and

WHEREAS, the NJDEP was the lead non-federal sponsor who signed a local cooperation agreement with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). The project design called for the placement

of sand to create a wider and higher elevation beach to withstand storm surge and wave attack during storms; and

WHEREAS, the project design was such that after 7 years periodic renourishment of the beach would be required with cost sharing from the USACE, NJDEP and the municipalities. This renourishment would occur over the 50 year life of the project as needed to ensure an adequate beach cross section existed to provide the needed protection for the upland areas. Nowhere in the USACE design is there a requirement for a dune; and

**WHEREAS**, the existence of the dune is superfluous to USACE, "engineered beach" design. Although the dune will afford some protection, its existence is not needed based on the USACE design for storm protection; and

WHEREAS, in this regard, reducing the height and/or width of the dune has no bearing on the USACE shore protection project; and

WHEREAS, residents along the beachfront area have complained about the limited view of the shoreline from their homes as a result of the increase in height of the dunes and the economic impact it has had on their home values; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the Borough of Manasquan respectfully requests the assistance of Governor Christie and New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to provide assistance to lowering the dunes, and

Public Safety & Recycling —Council Member McCarthy reported that following the Memorial Day Parade a patron severed his Achilles tendon while riding his bike and Sergeant Jerry Murphy, Officers Craig and Parker responded to the scene and addressed the situation until that person could be transported to the hospital. The patron reached out to the Chief to let him know the good job that his officers are doing. He stated that if there is any concerns about the construction at the high school please do not hesitate to contact the police department. He reported that there has been a large number of bicycle violations observed and reported by the police department and they are going to start issuing warnings and then a summons will follow for second offense.

Public Property & Parks – Council Member Mangan reported that Tourism will be holding a pizza eating contest Thursday, Main Beach at 2 p.m. and the kayak and canoe races will be this Saturday, July 21 at 10 a.m at Stockton Lake Park. He reported that the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Lighted Boat Parade applications are available throughout town. He stated that the use of borough property ad hoc committee met this week and made progress on better defining the 3 Borough areas that are used for events. He will report further at the next meeting.

Law and Code Committee – Council Member Jacobson reported on the amount of money collected for zoning permits, certificates of inspection, and building permits. She reported on the taxi problem where there were not enough taxis to get the patrons out of town at bar closing seems to have gotten better. She reported on the recycling and garbage on Ocean Ave and the surrounding streets that is put out a couple days prior to the scheduled day. She went over other issues that the committee discussed at the last meeting.

Public Works Committee – Council Member Donovan reported that the temporary fencing around the water plant will be removed within the next few weeks. He reported that the DPW continues to sample water around town. He reported that the pump for the fountain has been removed do to the pit flooding which is being investigated.

Administration and Finance – Council Member Connolly reported the committee will be researching companies that do surplus auction which should cover a wider audience and will add additional revenues. She reported on the amount of money brought in by the taxi ordinance. She went over website update regarding paying taxes by credit card. She reported that property tax bills have been sent out and are due August 1, 2012. She went over the new rates from the Monmouth County Board of Taxation.

Beach Committee – Council Member Bossone reported that the beach revenue so far is \$1,332,000 which is down slightly from last year at this time. He went over other events for the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration which will be the weekend of September 21, 2012.

#### AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Council Member Bossone made a motion to open meeting to the public, seconded by Council Member Connolly. Motion carried unanimously.

John Winterstella, former mayor, stated that the council should pay immediate attention to the Perrine Blvd. docks. He reported that he was around in 1977 when the docks were built and at that time money was put aside to maintain them and in the mid 90's they were re-decked and re-capped. He stated that today there is

a serious problem with the bulkhead eroding and sink holes. He suggested that the council take action before someone gets seriously injured.

There was discussion on the Perrine Blvd. docks and what needs to be done and the costs that would be involved in replacing the docks.

Fran Drew, 111 Third Avenue stated that she has the same problem at her house with the sink holes and she re-sheathed it from the water. She wanted to know who she should talk to about all the water that was on the streets on Sunday after a storm with no high tide.

Council Member Mangan stated that the rain on Sunday was almost a flash flood situation and that it was more rain then he has ever seen.

Ms. Drew wanted to know if a core sample has been taken or planned to be taken on the end of squan plaza where there is contaminated soil on the west end.

There was discussion on the soil contamination years ago and clean up.

Mike, Sinneck, Environmental Commission Chair reported on the clean up of the contaminated soil.

Mary Ryan, 1123 Beachfront thanked council for their part in the request to lower the dunes. She went over her opinion on the dune lowering.

Carol Wilkens Kirkman, 22 Willow Way stated that 2 sinks in the Ocean Avenue bathroom have not been working since June.

Council Member Bossone stated that there is a problem with the plumbing in the wall that is in the process of being fixed.

Ms. Kirkman stated that there are pedestrian crossing signs that have disappeared in the beach area and she believes that they should be put back.

Council Member McCarthy stated that he would look in to the signs.

Council Member Connolly made a motion to close the public portion, seconded by Council Member Sessone. Motion carried unanimously.

Council Member Donovan made a motion to adjourn the regular meeting at 9:17 p.m., seconded by Council Member McCarthy. Motion carried unanimously.
